Mike's career spans 32 years working in Hotels with some brilliant people in a dynamic industry where challenge and change is always a constant. He began in 1981 with Swallow Hotels and after working the shop floor in all departments his training and spending time within each management discipline he became the groups youngest General Manager in 1988 at the age of 28. Since arriving in Dundee in 1992 Mike has made the city his adopted home. He moved into a Regional role in the 90s with Swallow Hotels operating Hotels across Scotland and England and then as a Regional Director with Crerar Hotels before joining Hilton Worldwide in 2010 as General Manager at the beautiful Hilton Dunkeld House Hotel & Estate.

Throughout this period, Mike continued to live in the City of Dundee.

Mike's own motivation is fuelled by helping to create successful teams and in sharing success. He has never lost the love of direct contact with customers and with his teams. His skill base covers many disciplines associated with strong leadership and strategic business management.

Mike has always engaged his hotels with their local business economy. He is currently Chair of the Dundee & Angus Convention Bureau Business Events Development Group and is involved with the current Dundee Tourism Leadership Group reviewing the City's forward Leisure Tourism Strategy. For a period of seven years in his earlier days as Chair of the Dundee & Angus statutory Tourist board where the Ambassadors Program was first launched linking business events with academic research institutes in Dundee. The program was relaunched by the Dundee & Angus Convention Bureau in 2019 as the current Pathfinders Program. These roles have helped Mike develop relationships that have been beneficial to his business and have allowed him insight and input into shaping the local tourist economy.

Sir Michael Ferguson CBE, FRS, FRSE, FMedSci

Regius Professor of Life Sciences, Wellcome Centre for Anti-Infectives Research, School of Life Sciences, University of Dundee

Mike Ferguson obtained a PhD in Biochemistry (1982) at London University. He was a Postdoctoral Fellow at the Rockefeller University, New York, with George Cross FRS and at Oxford University with Raymond Dwek FRS. He took up a lectureship at The University of Dundee in 1988 and was promoted to a personal chair in Molecular Parasitology in 1994 and was appointed the first Regius Professor of Life Sciences in 2013.

He has published over 250 peer reviewed research papers and is known for solving the first structures of glycosylphosphatidylinositol (GPI) membrane anchors, which play important

roles throughout eukaryotic biology.

His research takes a multidisciplinary approach to understanding the biochemistry of protozoan parasites that cause tropical diseases, particularly the trypanosomatids that cause human African Sleeping Sickness, Chagas' disease and leishmaniasis. He believes in the fundamental importance of working across the Biology / Chemistry interface and is particularly interested in Translational Research. Together with his colleagues, he was instrumental in establishing the

Drug Discovery Unit at the University of Dundee and he is a member of the Wellcome Centre for Anti-Infectives Research. He is also co-Director of the successful Dundee Proteomics Facility.

Mike was Dean of Research for Life Sciences from 2007-2014 and continues to play a role in Research Strategy. He led the construction of the Discovery Centre for Translational and Interdisciplinary Research and is co-lead on the Growing the Tay Cities BioMedical Cluster component of the Tay Cities Deal. He is Deputy Chair of The Wellcome Trust and a member of the Board of Directors of the Medicines for Malaria Venture (MMV).

Mike is a fellow of the Royal Societies of London and Edinburgh and of the Academy of Medical Sciences and a member of EMBO. He was knighted in 2019 for services to science.



Charles Malone

Lecturer in Management and Head of Division Accounting Business and Management, Abertay University

Charles is an international management lecturer at Abertay with considerable experience of providing advice and consultancy in areas such as strategic planning and employee engagement and the Programme Leader for Business Management and the Chartered Management Institute lead on campus. He also leads Abertay's Innovation for Global Growth project which involves Abertay students and some of Scotland's leading employers - including Heineken, RBS and BT, SFA - working together to find solutions to business problems. As part of this project, Abertay students recently used computer games

technology to help design BT's first Customer Experience Lab. The event has been recognised for its contribution to graduate employability and employment.

His teaching is mainly in the areas of international management, organisational behaviour and critical management studies and is a Fellow of the Higher Education Academy and keen to explore contemporary approaches to teaching and learning. His approach to teaching is largely influenced by storytelling and innovative methods in assessment. Charles' most rewarding achievements to date have been being recognised by his students for his approaches to teaching through the Student Led Abertay Students Association Awards. He has been involved in numerous media projects examining the recent economic history of Dundee and employment in multi-national companies. He was part of the production team for the BBC documentary series 'Power to the People', and has been involved in a number of radio productions including guesting on a documentary for Radio Scotland hosted by Ricky Ross. Prior to teaching, Charles was employed by an American Multi-National Enterprise as a robotics technician.



Professor Colin D Campbell BSc, PhD, FRSB, MIoD, ARAgS, FRSE *Chief Executive, The James Hutton Institute*

Colin is Chief Executive of the James Hutton Institute and is responsible for leading the organisation and its 550 staff and 120 PhD students. He has broad interest in sustainable development and has developed the vision and mission of the institute around the UN Sustainable Development Goals. He sits on the Scottish Government's Forum for Natural Capital and has led research programmes on using the Ecosystem Approach to solve problems around land use decisions. He served on the RSE Commission of Inquiry "Facing up to Climate Change" and was a contributing author to the UK National Ecosystem Assessment. He has over 30 years of experience in soil microbiology/soil science applied

to agri-environment issues with expertise in fundamental and applied studies on the effects of pollutants on soil microorganisms and soil health and in understanding how microbial diversity contributes to ecosystem functioning. He is a Guest professor in the Soil and Environment Department, Swedish Agricultural Sciences University (SLU), Uppsala, Sweden and has also worked in Australia, South America and China looking at semi-tropical and temperate ecosystems there. He was an associate editor with <u>Soil Use and Management</u> and the <u>European Journal of Soil Science</u> and Applied Microbiology has acted as an expert advisor and participant in several EU and UK Government workshops addressing issues of the sustainable use of soils. He has over 120 research papers in soil science, land use and microbiology. He was elected as an Associate of the Royal Agricultural Societies (2017) and as a fellow to the Royal Society of Edinburgh (2018). He has had a long interest in the extent of microbial diversity in soils and the factors controlling their composition and distribution. He also studies of the use of biological indicators of soil health

and the effects of recycled organic matter on soil micro-organisms to better define the sustainability of such practices with a specific focus on soil protection and Statutory limits for heavy metals. His work

in Sweden with the <u>Swedish Agricultural Sciences University</u> (SLU) has been looking at micronutrient supply in farming systems in relation to localised soil resource-food quality issues. He is co-inventor of <u>MicroResp</u>, a novel physiological profiling method for characterising soils, sediments and waters and has other patents on novel <u>molecular fingerprinting</u> methods.



Professor Frank Müller

Assistant Vice-Principal (Dean of Learning and Teaching), University of St Andrews

The current AVP (Dean of Learning and Teaching) is Frank Lorenz Müller. He has held this role since February 2021.

Frank was born in 1970 and grew up in what was then West-Berlin, with a year in Bristol thrown in for good measure. Having graduated from the Free University of Berlin with a degree in History and English in 1996, he gained his DPhil as a Rhodes Scholar from the University of Oxford in 2000.

Frank was a Junior Research Fellow in History at University College Oxford before joining the School of History at St Andrews as a lecturer in 2002. A Senior Lecturer since 2005, Frank was promoted to a Professorship in Modern History in 2012. He mainly works on the politics and political culture of 19th and 20th-century Europe, with special interests in the history of monarchy, nationalism, liberalism and biography.

Frank has published books on British perceptions of German nationalism, the revolutions of 1848-1849, the German Emperor Frederick III and on succession in the monarchies of 19th-century Europe. He led the AHRC-funded project 'Heirs to the Throne in the Constitutional Monarchies of 19th-Century Europe' (2012-2017) and is founder-editor of the 'Palgrave Studies in Modern Monarchy'. His current research interest is the legacy of monarchy in post-WW1 Europe.

Professor Dr Alexander Baldacchino

Professor of Medicine, Psychiatry and Addictions, University of St Andrews, Consultant and Clinical Lead in Addiction Medicine, NHS Fife Addiction Services, NHS Fife Research, Development and Innovation Director and President, International Society of Addiction Medicine

Alex is Professor of Medicine, Psychiatry and Addiction sat the University of St Andrews and Consultant Psychiatrists with NHS Fife Addiction Services, Scotland, United Kingdom. He has been principal investigator in biological, neuropsychological, neuroimaging, clinical and policy related research portfolios when working with the Universities of London, Cambridge, Dundee and St Andrews for the last 25 years. In the last 15 years he has been

the UK principal investigator to several European Union funded projects. These include looking at barriers and challenges faced by individuals with substance misuse related problems accessing treatment (IATPAD Study), a cross-cultural multicentre study to determine the nature, extent and management of drug related mental health problems in Europe (Drugs and Psychosis and ISADORA Studies), internet and drug addiction (Psychonaut 2002) and Overdose Risk InfOrmation Project (ORION) amongst others. His research portfolio has a common thread of understanding the comorbid conditions (physical and psychological) arising as a result of chronic abuse of pharmacological agents with dependence potential especially opioids, nicotine and alcohol. He has around 150 peer reviewed publications.

He is Board Director and President with the International Society of Addictions Medicine (ISAM) and NHS Fife Director for Research, Development and Innovation
